BWF Apprentice of the Year Award 2022 Entry Form

The BWF Apprentice of the Year Award celebrates the achievements of woodworking apprentices. Previous winners of the Award have really stood out from the crowd, either through fantastic feats in their work or extraordinary commitment that has added value to their place of work.

Judging Criteria

The Apprentice of the Year Award will be judged against the following criteria:

Outstanding achievement – Quality of workmanship to agreed quality targets and standards.

Safety first attitude – Applies a safety-first attitude when undertaking instructions and work.

Commitment – Demonstrates good attendance, timekeeping, attitude, and work ethic.

Adding value – Benefit to the company and use of own initiative to improve workplace processes and/or product quality. **Personal development** – Benefitted from his/her training in terms of maturity and workmanship.

Entry Requirements

To enter complete this Award entry form and submit with the following information:

- A short description of up to three projects with supporting photographs, including a picture of the apprentice (in electronic jpeg format).
- A testimony/reference from the employer covering the key criteria (no more than 500 words).
- A testimony/reference from the college trainer/lecturer covering where possible the key judging criteria (no more than 500 words).
- A short video from the apprentice on what they have gained from their training and what winning this Award would mean to them. The video can simply be taken on a smart phone.

Entry Rules

- Apprentices in all UK woodworking businesses are eligible to enter.
- Individuals on a formal apprenticeship programme within a woodworking related business. This could include apprentices undertaking or having achieved Architectural/Bench Joinery, Wood Machining and Wood Product Manufacturing or in other areas of the company such as business administration, finance, or human resources.
- An apprentice is eligible if still studying or have completed their studies within 12 months of the entry closing date.
- There is no Award entry fee, and all shortlisted entries will receive two complimentary tickets to the annual Awards Dinner, thanks to our generous sponsors.
- There are no limits on the number of entries per company, but only one entry per person.
- Previous winners or shortlisted entries cannot be submitted.
- By submitting this Award entry form you are giving the BWF permission to use images, videos and details of the entry to promote the Awards and provide examples of best practice on the BWF website and across associated PR.
- Entry forms must be received by no later than **17.00 on Friday 2nd September 2022**

Awards Presentation
