Brexit

- CE Marking applied to most products supplied into the UK since the 1990's...
- The UK left the European Union on 31 January 2020 following a 2016 referendum
- The transition period ended on 31 December 2020






The UKCA Mark



- "UK Conformity Assessed"
- <u>Can</u> be affixed from 1 January 2021
- Must be affixed to most products from 1 January 2023
- Operates in broadly the same manner as CE marking

UK Regulations

Each of the "CE Marking" regulations is now "frozen" into UK law with the content that it had in 2019

Many EU regulations require the use of an EU appointed "Notified Body" to perform conformity assessment, product inspections and/or conduct factory quality inspections as part of the attestation process.

UK regulations have the same requirement but this activity now must be performed by a UK-appointed "Approved Body" such as BSI



Notified v Approved Bodies

All appointed "Approved Bodies" are listed on the "UK Market Conformity Assessment Bodies" (UKMCAB) database website – this is the definitive place to check if a body has been notified to support UKCA marking.

Format of UKCA mark



- For Regulations where no Approved Body is required, for example
 - Electrical equipment
 - ROHS
 - EMC
 - Toys
 - Some machinery & pressure equipment
 - Some construction products
- Operates by self declaration as with CE Marking

Displaying the UKCA mark



- For Regulations where an Approved Body is required, for example
 - Gas Appliances
 - Most construction products
 - Radio Equipment
 - Personal Protective Equipment
 - Dangerous Machines (Annex IV)
 - Most pressure equipment

Markings <u>can</u> be combined...



- ✓ <u>CE Marking</u> activity can only be undertaken by an <u>EU "Notified Body"</u>
- ✓ <u>UKCA Marking</u> activity can only be undertaken by a <u>UK</u> <u>"Approved Body"</u>
- ✓ The UKCA Mark may be combined with the CE Mark on products for both EU & GB markets

- The UKCA mark
- Name and address of manufacturer
- Product identification/model number
- UK approved body number (eg:0086)
- Relevant legislation
- Product performance
- Date of issue
- Name and signature

Role of Standards... UKCA Marking

- UK regulations recognize the importance of standards in the same way
- Compliance with appropriate standards gives "presumption of conformity" under most regulations
- Compliance with appropriate standards may be mandatory for some regulations (eg: Construction Products)
- Appropriate standards are called "Designated Standards" in the UK
- These are currently identical to the EU lists, but can be expected to diverge
- Will be EN standards, but could be ISO, IEC, BS etc.

Northern Ireland – a unique challenge

- Northern Ireland Protocol and Anglo-Irish Agreement make the introduction of any hard border politically very difficult.
- Manufacturers in Northern Ireland have unfettered trade with ROI <u>and</u> rest of the UK






Supplying goods into/out of Northern Ireland


 Products supplied in Northern Ireland must comply with all relevant <u>EU regulations</u>.

- Compliance indicated by the CE mark (using EU Notified Body) or;
- Compliance indicated by the CE UKNI mark (using UK <u>Notified</u> Body)
- EU Declaration of Conformity required
- Goods from non-EU (inc GB) are <u>imported</u>
- Goods from EU are <u>distributed</u>
- Authorised Representative (where required) cannot be in GB
- UKCA mark is NOT ACCEPTED in NI UKNI mark is NOT ACCEPTED in EU



Importing goods into Northern Ireland


- Companies bringing goods into NI from GB or non-EU countries will become "Importers".
- Most product-safety regulations impose duties on "Importers" to make checks to ensure that products do meet regulations
- For goods from the EU, companies will be "distributors", with reduced responsibility



For Northern Ireland Manufacturers

- Northern Ireland businesses have unfettered access to the entire UK market
- For "Qualifying Goods" only...
- No further approvals are needed
- So all these marks are acceptable in GB in addition to the UKCA mark...

Importing & Distributing - Example


- 1) Goods of origin in the EU
- 2) NI Ireland business is <u>distributor</u>
- 3) But if goods then supplied on to GB the NI business becomes a UK <u>importer</u>
- 4) You cannot route goods through NI to avoid the UKCA regulations in force in GB



Divergence

- Most technical rules are contained within standards, not Regulations.
- UK remains committed to membership of CEN and CENELEC (BSI as NSB)
- UK is likely to continue to use European standards for most products
- Divergence will be small in short term...



(Draft) - UK Construction Products Regulations 2022

Planned secondary legislation linked to The Building Safety Bill

Maintain existing regulatory approach for products already subject to a UK Designated Standard



Summary (1)



- The UK left the EU on 31 January 2020 and the agreed transition period ended at the end of 2020
- CE marking continues to be <u>accepted</u> until 1 January 2023
- The UKCA mark has been developed to replace the CE Mark in GB
- Technical requirements are the same but may diverge over time

Summary (2)

- Goods supplied in NI must meet EU Regulations
- Goods from GB are "imported" into Northern Ireland
- Compliance is demonstrated via CE Mark using an EU Notified Body, or the CE UKNI mark if using a UK Notified Body
- Northern Ireland businesses can place qualifying products onto the whole UK market using CE mark or CE UKNI mark
