I. Economy

Economy

- In May, according to the <u>CBI's Distributive Trades Survey</u>, 60% of respondents reported that sales volumes were up on a year ago, and 9% said they were down, giving a balance of 51%. On balance, 58% of firms expects sales volumes to increase in June.
- According to the ONS, UK GDP growth in 2015 Q1 was unrevised from the preliminary estimates of 0.3% on a quarterly basis and 2.4% year-on-year. The reported contraction in construction activity was revised to 1.1% quarter-on-quarter and 0.3% year-on-year.
- According to the ONS, in 2015 Q1, business investment increased 1.7% compared with the previous quarter and was 3.7% higher compared to a year earlier.

Housing

• The number of mortgages approved for house purchase rose by 3.1% year-on-year and by 7.4% month-on-month in April, according to the British Bankers' Association. The value of these loans was 5.4% higher than March 2014 and increased 7.1% compared with the previous month. The number of loans for re-mortgaging rose 5.6% year-on-year and 9.2% month-on-month.

2. Major Announcements

Circular Economy consultation launched by European Commission

The European Commission has issued its consultation document on the circular economy, the earlier proposals having been withdrawn in February. The deadline for comments is 20 August and the Association will be making an input. Find the consultation documents here. The Commission is assessing support for binding rules on product design as part of a wide-ranging consultation on the direction of the new circular economy package. Interest groups are asked whether they would prefer minimum requirements for durability under the EU's Ecodesign Directive, for example, over industry-led self-regulatory measures. Other options to promote the circular economy principles in product design could include developing standards for voluntary use, or reviewing rules on legal and commercial guarantees. The Commission is also seeking views on which product groups should be addressed as a priority, with white goods, small domestic appliances, packaging material, clothing, furniture and cars all listed as options. Innovate UK - Building Performance Evaluation (BPE) Programme (Non-Domestic)

The report "Early Findings from Non-Domestic Projects" sets out the preliminary findings from 23 non-domestic projects covering the construction of schools, supermarkets, offices and clinics etc. Its aim was to measure the gap between designer's objectives and what happens when the occupants move in. Building Regulations (England) Approved Document E - Resistance to the passage of sound

A new edition of AD E has been published by DCLG. This is the 2003 edition incorporating amendments for 2004, 2010, 2013 and 2105. The main changes made by the 2015 amendments is an update of the references to standards for schools. This edition took effect on 6 April 2015. There has been no change to Part E of Schedule I of the Building Regulations (England) 2010. This document also applies to building work carried out on excepted energy buildings in Wales as defined in the Welsh Ministers (Transfer of Functions) (No. 2) Order 2009. Apart from this exception, for the time being, Wales will continue to use the original AD E 2010 edition. ESOS compliance and case studies requested by the EA and DECC

Government established ESOS to implement Article 8 (4-6) of the EU Energy Efficiency Directive (2012/27/EU). The ESOS Regulations 2014 give effect to the scheme. The Environment Agency is the UK scheme administrator. ESOS applies to any UK company that either employs 250 or more people, or has an annual turnover in excess of 50 million euro. Organisations must carry out assessments by 5 December 2015 which include audits of the energy used by their buildings, industrial processes and transport and identify cost-effective energy saving measures. For details click here. Companies qualify for ESOS if fully covered by ISO 50001. In addition, DECC and the Environment Agency wish to develop some case studies regarding ESOS compliance, the intent is to show how a number of companies from different backgrounds have complied with ESOS. House of Commons recess dates Announced

Leader of the House of Commons Chris Grayling has announced recess dates for the House in the coming session:

Summer recess - 21 July - 7 September

Conference recess - 17 September - 12 October November recess - 10 November - 16 November Christmas recess- 17 December - 5 January February recess - 11 February - 22 February

Queens Speech 2015

The Queen's Speech, which took place on Wednesday 27 May announced 25 new bills, along with one draft bill. A brief explanation of each bill that is relevant to industry is below:

- The **Enterprise Bill** will cut business regulation and enable easier resolution of disputes for small businesses. It will also introduce a cap on public sector redundancy pay and business rate appeals reform.
- The National Insurance Contributions/Finance Bill will ensure that tax rates, VAT and National Insurance will be frozen for the next five years.
- The Housing Bill will extend Right to Buy to housing association tenants. It will increase the supply of Starter Homes and simplify the neighbourhood planning system.
- The **Energy Bill** will establish the Oil and Gas Authority as an independent regulator of the industry and will allow local planning authorities to have a greater say over onshore wind farms in their area.
- The Cities and Local Government Devolution Bill will provide new primary legislative powers to devolved powers and budgets to local areas. It will also make provision for elected mayors with extended powers in areas that wish to have them.
- The **High Speed Rail (London-West Midlands) Bill** will provide the Government with the legal powers to construct and operate phase one of HS2.
- The Scotland Bill will devolve further powers to the Scottish Parliament, including control of income tax, air passenger duty and borrowing.
- The Wales Bill will devolve further powers to the National Assembly for Wales, including over certain energy projects, transport regulation and voting for 16 and 17 year olds.
- The European Union Referendum Bill will allow an in/out referendum on the UK's membership of the European Union to be held.
